I am interested in a Fall 09 admission.

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Yes, the overall theme is on security/terrorism issues especially related to Israel and its neighbors. A one-credit class comparing Biblical and Koranic law and a 2 credit class dealing with Israel's unique security situation.

Greeter\_Natali welcome ATY!

Aaron Gulbransen That is incredibly exciting.

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Aaron, also exciting is that Jay Sekulow of the ACLJ is one of the teachers in the 2 credit class.

Admissions\_Bonnie Mr. Hofler; good to have you with us tonight. We invite you to schedule a day to sit in on law classes in the new year.

Aaron Gulbransen I'm assuming that would only be open to students that have completed their 1L year?

Thomas Hofler Thanks Ms. Creef. It was good meeting you in person last week.

Admissions\_Bonnie Thanks for taking the time to stop in and introduce yourself.

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Yes, at least the 1L year complete. Some 2Ls will go too.

Thomas Hofler I did have a question that I asked above.

Admissions\_Bonnie The one about credits being forgiven in law if you are a jt student with Business??

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Thomas, yes, if you are admitted to the joint degree program, it would reduce the number of credits you need to take in the law school.

ATY2012 Question for anyone..with the recent announcement concereneing Pat Robertson's leadership and the change with CBN how with this affect Regent Law School?

Thomas Hofler Yes, not sure if I get any credits applied to in the Law program from the MBA program?

Thomas Hofler Thanks Dean Brauch

Aaron Gulbransen Bonnie, I was disappointed in my LSAT score. I had been scoring at or close to 160 on the practice tests. Unfortunately, I scored only 154 on the actual test. I have very good recommendations, but a 3.08 GPA. Should I be worried?

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Thomas, the way it works is that you take fewer classes in the law school because we assume some of what you learn in your MBA classes satisfies the objectives we have in law.

Aaron Gulbransen I'm considering taking the LSAT again in Feb., but would rather not go through that stressful process again.

Admissions\_Bonnie Correct Thomas -- law will reduce; Business no longer reduces. You may want to schedule a telephone conversation with Assoc Dean Natt Gantt to gain further insight into exactly what classes would be reduced.

Greeter\_Natali Excellent! Do you have any questions for us?  
Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Aaron, you can qualify for all of those programs based on law school performance

Admissions\_Bonnie LSAT score affects scholarship; other programs are influenced by law school grades.

Aaron Gulbransen Ok, good.  
Student\_Jonathan Programs like law review are based on grades or competitions, not on LSAT scores

Aaron Gulbransen I just wanted to make sure.  
Aaron Gulbransen Thank you.  
jaydemitch Not really. I wanted to see what topics where being discussed and then move from that point.

John from TX What is the grading system based upon at Regent ?  
JasperLukose How much emphasis does the program put on trial advocacy preparation, and legal writing?

FinAid\_Tom International scholarships have an element of academic merit base, but not as much as our other merit-based scholarships. We will look at your academic history, grades, leadership exp, LSATs, etc

prangkitty Will I have to apply separately for these scholarships?  
Greeter\_Natali Welcome to the chat, JeeHee! How are you tonight?  
JeeHee Hello, I am well, how are you?  
Student\_Rachel There is a lot of focus on legal writing, especially, the first year  
Thomas Hofler Bonnie or Dean Brauch: Will the MBA GPA (at the time of admission application) have an impact on the admissions consideration? Will it weigh as heavy as undergrad scores (in light of it being over twenty years since I graduated undergrad)?

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Jasper, we put a lot of emphasis on advocacy skills. Everyone takes an outstanding--and rigorous--writing course in the first year. They also can take trial practice classes and compete for our trial teams

Greeter\_Natali I'm doing quite well.  
prangkitty I also wanted to know what GPA is required to maintain the scholarship  
FinAid\_Tom Prangkitty, if your LSAT is at/above 155, then no -scholarships will be awarded after acceptance to the law school. If your LSAT is less than 155, then yes. I will specifically contact Intl students who are accepted to offer assistance.

Admissions\_Bonnie Thomas -- both GPAs will affect the admissions decision, also the twenty-year lapse. We will also look at your work history.

Aaron Gulbransen Dean, will the Israel program conflict with the Strasbourg one timewise?

John from TX Is there an emphasis on human rights and immigration law?

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Aaron, no. Haifa is scheduled right before Strasbourg so that students can do both if they want

prangkitty Okay then, got it. I already sent my application in so I will just wait to hear. How long will that be?

Aaron Gulbransen Beautiful!

Aaron Gulbransen Well, those are all the questions I had.

Aaron Gulbransen Thank you.

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch John, yes. We have courses in both. We also have a summer abroad program in Strasbourg, France devoted to human rights law

Aaron Gulbransen Thanks everyone and have a great night!

Admissions\_Bonnie Our admissions committee will convene in mid-January. Finaid will be awarded as soon as finaid is notified of an applicant's admission.

Greeter\_Natali Good night, Aaron. Thanks for coming.

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Bye Aaron

Aaron Gulbransen Bye.

FinAid\_Tom Prangkitty, the scholarship requirement is 3.0 cumulative GPA after 1L. If you fall short, the scholarship is not lost, but reduced. As an intl student, did you have any trouble funding your undergrad?

JasperLukose I know the application is looked at as a whole, but realistically how does an applicant with an LSAT score of 143 fare?

Sebrina Due to my current employment, my plans would initially be to enter the program part-time, but would I be able to switch to the full-time program as I get further into the law program?

jaydemitch Admissions\_Bonnie: what could I expect the result to be if in the first few years of study at university I did not do well but in the later parts have demonstrated competently that I was deserving of my degrees?

JasperLukose With a 3.65 GPA

prangkitty No, I did my undergrad in Jamaica and my parents paid for that but to do this law school I will definitely need help.

Admissions\_Bonnie Jasper, a person with a 143 score should plan to retest. We place the most weight on the highest score.

Thomas Hofler Thanks, Ms. Creef. What merit scholarships or minority scholarships financial aid are available?

ATY2012 FinAid Tom - I have reviewed the scholarships online, are there any others available?

Admissions\_Bonnie Jay, you may make a one-time switch at the end of your first year.

FinAid\_Tom Prangkitty, you will certainly need to begin the fin aid process early. When you do plan to apply (for admissions?)

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Sebrina, yes, you can switch into the full-time program later if that works better for you

Greeter\_Natali Welcome, Tim!

Greeter\_Natali Where are you chatting from tonight?

Admissions\_Bonnie prangkitty Jay, an upward grade trend is very important. I already submitted my application. LSDAS was having some challenges with my transcript so that is the only thing missing

JasperLukose Does Regent take the best score of LSAT's taken, or the average of all tests taken?

jaydemitch Sorry. No, for my undergraduate at Fairmont State University I did not do well, but later I did. How would admission look at the transcript?

Tim prangkitty Hi Natali, I'm from Oklahoma  
Where should I start looking for finaid aside from scholarships? Any suggestions?

Admissions\_Bonnie Jasper; we place the most weight on the highest score (hopefully the most recent score), but we do view ALL scores.

Greeter\_Natali Sebrina Great. Have you had any snow yet?  
Would I be able to obtain credit by challenging a course due to work experience?

Tim JasperLukose No, we're running behind this year lol  
I took the test twice, and the second time I achieved a better score, however the average was 143.

Greeter\_Natali Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Tim, any questions this evening?  
Sebrina, no. Once in school, you can get credit for doing some volunteer positions (externships) where you are supervised and have certain learning goals.

FinAid\_Tom As an intl student, you will need to look into private law school loans -either from the US or Jamaica, plus any affinities you may have (organizations, church, businesses, etc). You are in Phoenix? What are you doing there?

prangkitty Tim I am presently in a management trainee program at a resort  
Not, at this point... I'm just logging in to see if I can learn anything from the discussion. My app is complete and I'm waiting to hear back. I guess I have approx 1 more month?

Career\_Kathy Sebrina- many students do externships or internships during the semester or summer with judges, firms, public interest organizations, etc. to complement their education and gain practical experience

Greeter\_Natali JasperLukose Yes, the Admissions Committee will meet first in mid-January.  
Coming from Chicago, I'd like to move back to Chicago to practice. Does Regent help me prepare for the Chicago Bar Exam within the curriculum?

Admissions\_Bonnie Tim, if your file is complete then we should deliver a decision before the end of Jan.

Thomas Hofler TOM (FINANCIAL AID): Law school is obviously an expensive undertaking. I have a family and am concerned about financial aid and continuing to work for some reasonable amountof time during law school? Is this a realistic expectation? (working during law school).

FinAid\_Tom Prangkitty, that sounds great. Contact me early in January at lawfinaid@regent.edu and we can discuss your fin aid options in further detail.

jaydemitch Is there any indepth study in the foundation of Hebrew Law that would be implemented in the coursework litigation/business/etc. law?

Tim That sounds wonderful, the sooner I hear back the better for relocating my fam (wife and two girls). Thanks!

prangkitty I will surely do. Thank you very much.

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Jasper, our curriculum is designed for people from all over the country. We require courses that we know are tested on most state bars (incl IL)--like the uniform commercial code, family law, evidence etc. Our IL bar takers have done well

FinAid\_Tom As a full time student, the ABA limits your work hrs to (up to) 20 per week. As a first-year law student, you should restrict your work hrs as much as possible.

Admissions\_Bonnie Many students work 15-20 hours per week. It is preferable to avoid working your first semester if possible.

John from TX Does Regent accept Transfer students after their first year?

Law\_Wife\_Tamra Tim, we have a wonderful group for your wife to be involved in in which she can meet other law wives and get involved with Bible studies, Girls Night Outs, Moms groups, etc. Would she be interested in something like this? How old are your children?

Thomas Hofler So I take it that the first semester is pretty intense?

Greeter\_Natali Tim, just so you know we have a representative here from Law Wives (Tamra)--it is a wonderful group of women who support each other during their husbands' school!

Student\_Jonathan The first semester is intense, but rewarding

JasperLukose Does Regent have accelerated programs or part-time programs?

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Jaydemitch, we have course specifically in Biblical law (focused on OT law and its relevance today). All students also take Biblical Foundations of Law as 1Ls

FinAid\_Tom Thomas -to say the least. Get to know how you study, the amount of time you need, when do you study, etc before you consider how much (and if) you can work.

Student\_Jonathan The studies are fascinating, but there is a lot of work to do

As for second and third years, full-time students are not allowed by the ABA to work more than 20 hours a week.

Greeter\_Natali Tim, currently the market here is pretty stagnant.

FinAid\_Tom Tim, some do. That is a risk these days. If you have equity to invest it is worth considering.

Law\_Wife\_Tamra Tim, we bought our home when we moved to Virginia Beach from Los Angeles and we plan to sell it before we leave next year...

Student\_Rachel Even without the restriction, it would be impossible (I think) to work more than that while going to school.

My ultimate goal is to become a judge, is there a recommended path or anything that would be advantageous for me to do while in law school, i.e. a certain class or club?

Student\_Jonathan Colby Bardin Full-time study takes up all of my time.  
Do most law students have (legal) jobs, or are they "typical" off-campus jobs?

Sondra I am at the beginning stages of looking at law school and I'm anticipating applying for the 2009 admission. Would the June LSAT be good to take for 2009 admissions?

Dale2006Alum Rush hours on Indian River Road are pretty bad. Maybe not as bad as rush hour in a place like LA, Houston, or Atlanta...

Greeter\_Natali Sondra, our priority consideration date is typically Feb. 1, so a June LSAT would be plenty early! If you need extra time to prepare, the Oct. or Dec. test would also work.

Student\_Rachel There is a mix. Many students work on-campus (as GAs or in the library). Many legal jobs do not pay, especially when you're a 1L.

Curric\_Dean\_Gantt Pensacola, there are many paths to obtaining a judgeship. However, many prospective judges start out with a government job, like a being a local prosecutor. Therefore, as a student, obtaining an internship with a prosecutor's office would be helpful.

Faculty\_Dean\_Brauch Pensacola, I recommend clerking for a judge. I would also take classes on trial practice, appellate advocacy etc. There is no single track to judgeship, but you might also consider a job as a prosecutor out of school. That is a decent route for many.

Admissions\_Bonnie Sondra: June, Oct. or Dec. would be my recommendations. But most importantly, don't test until you're absolutely ready. Your timed, practice tests will indicate whether you're properly prepared or not. If you're scoring 150 and above, you may be ready.

Kathy Fuller Is the academic culture of Regent conducive for non-traditional older students? A student with a male spouse and adult independent children. Is there a organization law husbands?

Colby Bardin I second Bonnie on that. . .:)

Curric\_Dean\_Gantt Pensacola, I agree with the Dean that serving as a clerk to a judge also can open your eyes to the judicial process.

This policy applies even if you cancel your score or it is not otherwise reported. LSAC reserves the right to cancel your registration, rescind your admission ticket, or take any other steps necessary to enforce this policy. However, you may retake the LSAT if a law school to which you are applying requires a more recent score than any you have on record, or approves your retaking the test, and the school provides LSAC with written proof of its requirement no later than the last day of registration for the test.
