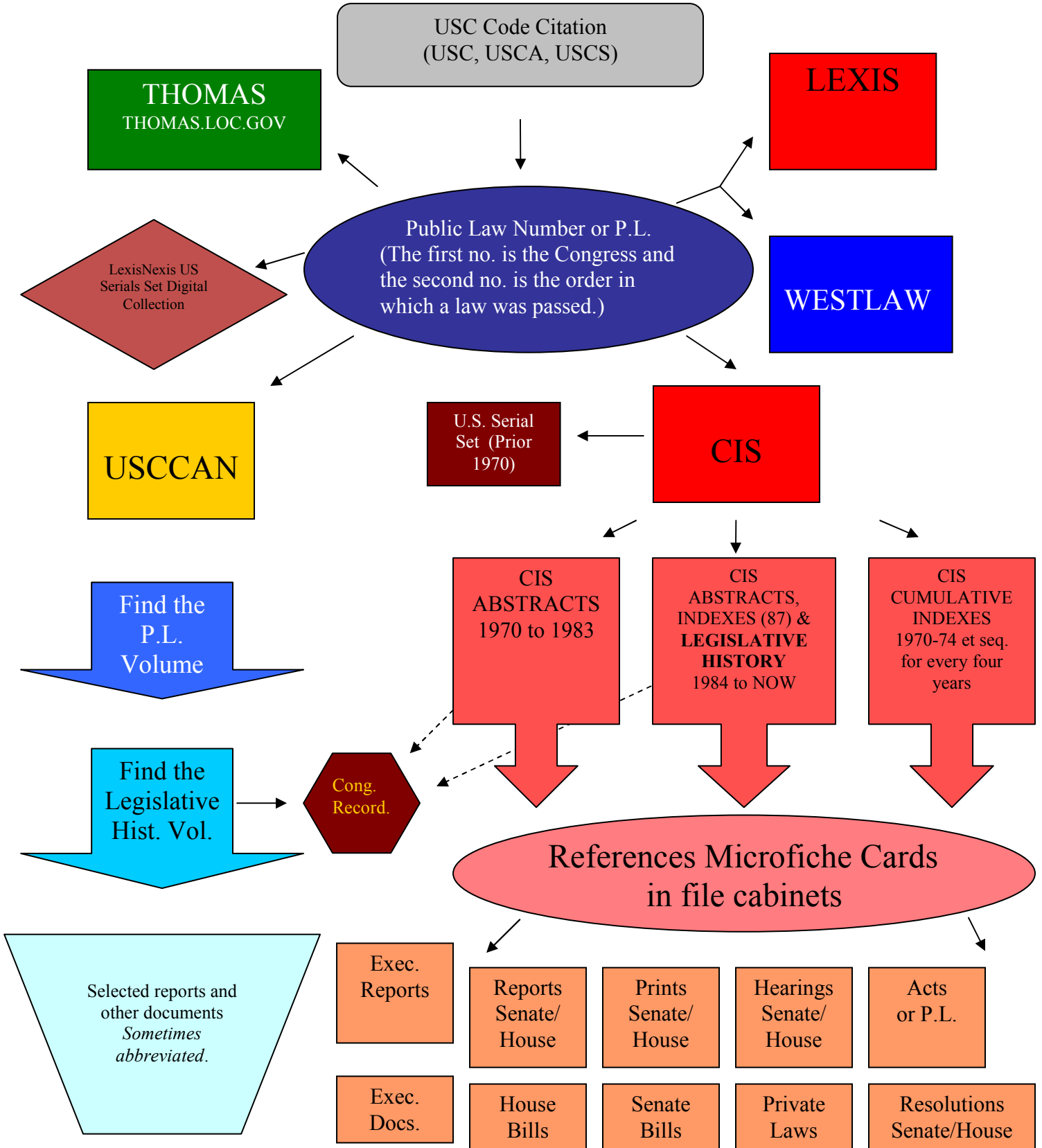


FEDERAL LEGISLATIVE HISTORY CHART

Engrossed Bill – a bill passed by either House or Senate and is presented to either House or Senate depending upon where it originated.

Enrolled Bill – a bill passed by both House and Senate and which is presented to the President for signature or veto.
