

New Elective Course Rotation Schedule

Dear Students:

As was explained in previous e-mail announcements, we have decided to move certain of our upper-level elective courses from being offered every year to being offered every other year. We are making this change due to the fact that these courses historically have low enrollment and are not heavily bar-tested. We already informed you that the following courses will be on an alternating year schedule:

- LAW 704—Employment Law
- LAW 724—International Business Transactions
- LAW 726—Securities Regulation
- LAW 743—Health Care Law
- LAW 758—Civil Pretrial Practice & Procedure
- LAW 771—Partnership Tax

In addition to those courses, the courses below will now be offered every other year:

- LAW 632—Criminal Pretrial Practice
- LAW 669—Bioethics
- LAW 701—Business Planning
- LAW 711—Jurisprudence
- LAW 712—Legal History
- LAW 725—Insurance
- LAW 727—Mergers & Acquisitions
- LAW 742—Admiralty
- LAW 752—Law Practice Management
- LAW 766—Land Use Planning
- LAW 768—Environmental Law
- LAW 831—Crime and Punishment
- LAW 862—Entertainment Law

For the next two academic years, the elective courses listed above are tentatively scheduled as follows:

Fall 2009 (these courses will not be offered again until fall 2011):

Admiralty, Criminal Pretrial Practice, Environmental Law, Insurance, Jurisprudence, Business Planning.

Spring 2010 (these courses will not be offered again until spring 2012):

Law Practice Management, Land Use Planning, Entertainment Law, Mergers & Acquisitions.

Fall 2010 (these courses will not be offered again until fall 2012):

Bioethics, Crime and Punishment, Employment Law, International Business Transactions, Legal History.

Spring 2011 (these courses will not be offered again until spring 2013):

Securities Regulation, Health Care Law, Civil Pretrial Practice and Procedure, Partnership Tax.

Sports Law (LAW 863) will be taught in Fall 2009 and Fall 2010 and then will begin an alternating year rotation.

Other electives not listed above will typically continue to be offered every year. Required upper-level courses and those listed in the first set of limited electives on the Juris Doctor Degree Program Checklist (Family Law, UCC II, UCC III, and Wills, Trusts & Estates) will continue to be offered every semester.

Please note that all courses are subject to being cancelled for insufficient enrollment in any term.
