Primary responsibilities:

My overall focus was re-searching how faith influences international affairs and the promotion of international religious freedom.

I researched and wrote one web-exclusive article to be published by *The Review of Faith and International Affairs* online. This article analyzed the current religious education initiative introduced into Russian state schools.

I also assisted senior staff with research on international projects and prepared read-ahead material for international confer-

ences. I compiled news reports for global regions of interest. I read, summarized and edited conference papers for a compilation publication, and I completed general administrative duties as well.

Memorable Moment:

My most memorable moment was attending the Global Leadership Forum, co-sponsored by Institute for Global Engagement and the Prince Alwaleed Bin Talal Center for Muslim-Christian Understanding at Georgetown University.

This was a two day forum that discussed Evangelical and Muslim relations, perceptions, and partnerships. The forum was a tremendous learning experience for me as a Religious Studies student.

Reflections: This internship experience helped me hone my skills and develop

my interests in the field of religious studies. My main interest surrounds Christian ethical engagement in society and government. I am also interested in Church-State relations.

In today's post-secular and globalized world, it is becoming increasingly more important for Christians to learn to live and engage in a pluralistic and diverse society.

The internship enabled me to expand my career ambitions and to be a competitive candidate for future jobs. Through this experience, I received a possible opportunity to intern at the State Department in the Office of International Religious Freedom next summer as well.

After visiting the RSU Career website, take time to further research your internship. Type your interest or career field into Google to find leaders in the field. Examine their websites to identify internship opportunities.

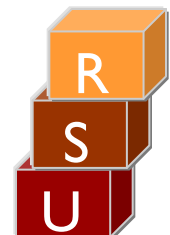
If you are interested in a company and they do not have internships listed on website, contact its Human Resources department. Perhaps talking to their HR representatives
