

Regent University Fire Safety Report

- statistics for the three most recent calendar years for which data are available for
 - the number of fires and the cause of each fire = **0**
 - the number of [persons who received fire-related injuries that resulted] in treatment at a medical facility, including at an on-campus health center = **0**
 - the number of deaths related to a fire = **0**
 - the value of property damage caused by a fire = **\$0**
- a description of each housing facility fire safety system, including the fire sprinkler system - **Automated electronic smoke/heat detection and fire suppression system. Smoke/heat detection directly linked to activation of water-based, zone effective fire suppression system. Activation of system simultaneously:**
 - **Sounds a building-wide evacuation alarm (inclusive of audio claxons and visual strobes)**
 - **Notifies Regent/CBN Police Department of both time and zone of activation**
 - **Simultaneously notifies third-party monitoring agency for fire safety system**
- the number of fire drills held during the previous calendar year (number of fire drills in 2009 for the 2010 report) **3 drills held per calendar year: 1 each for spring, summer and fall semesters**
- policies or rules on portable electrical appliances, smoking, and open flames; **Residence hall policies prohibiting open flames (to include smoking), exposed heating elements and non-issued appliances are provided to all residents via the Residence Hall Handbook:**

- procedures for evacuation; **All residence hall rooms have a fire evacuation plan & diagram posted on the back of the main housing assignment door**
- policies regarding fire safety education and training programs provided to students and employees, including the procedures students and employees should follow in the case of a fire; **All student housing staff (to include undergraduate Resident Assistants residing on the residence hall floors) are annually (every August) trained on fire safety awareness & fire response/evacuation (to include live discharge of fire extinguisher). Student housing staff follow the same evacuation routes/procedures as those posted on the back of all student housing assignment main doors.**
- for the purposes of including a fire in the statistics, the titles of each person or organization to which students and employees should report that a fire occurred;
 - **Regent/CBN Police Dispatch Officer**
 - **Regent/CBN Police Lieutenant**
 - **Regent/CBN Police Chief**
 - **Director of CBN Facilities Services**
 - **Vice President for Student Services**
 - **Director of Student Housing**
 - **Area Director for residence hall involved**

- plans for future improvements in fire safety, if determined necessary by the institution.
