Investigating COVID-19-related trauma symptomatology among adults using the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory-2 Restructured Form (MMPI-2-RF). The aim of using the MMPI-2-RF, a well-researched broadband measure with robust psychometric properties, was to provide insight into the extent of psychological symptoms and the clinical significance of traumatic stress. Determining the significance of these symptoms can be additive for mental health professionals working with adults who have gone through the COVID-19 pandemic or similar events in the future, allowing them to adapt treatment focus for identified trauma symptomatology.
