Based on your application and FASFA, this scholarship will pay full tuition, room, fees and provide stipends for books, transportation and board for costs associated with one year of NROTC preparatory study – a value of up to \$XXXXXX.

This preparatory scholarship provides a unique opportunity to develop your talents and leads to a commission in the United States Navy. Once you accept this offer and your eligibility is verified the Navy will reserve a follow-on four-year Naval ROTC scholarship in your name to Old Dominion University. To claim the four-year Navy scholarship you must successfully complete Old Dominion University's NROTC Preparatory Program. Successful program completion includes completing NROTC Student Indoctrination in Great Lakes, Ill, maintaining at least a 2.8 while pursuing a technical major, be in good standing with the NROTC Hampton Roads unit (not on probation, warning or leave of absence status) agree to the terms of the NROTC scholarship contract and receive the ODU Professor of Navy Science recommendation.

This NROTC preparatory scholarship is applied to remaining costs following application of all student aid and other scholarships for which you are eligible. Our NROTC crosstown partner, Regent University, administers portions of the Hampton Roads NROTC preparatory program. For your preparatory year, you should expect to split courses between Old Dominion and Regent while living in the Hampton Roads NROTC residencies at Regent. Details can be found at.....
