General Notes

- Check Degree Works or the Catalog for course pre-requisite information.
- Minimum C- grade for major coursework required
- > 50% of major requirements must be taken at Regent University
- A minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA is required to maintain good academic standing.
- Some majors also require a minimum grade in all major courses.
- As a general rule, 100 and 200 level courses should be taken prior to upper level (300 and 400) level courses.
- A minimum of 120 credits is required.
- A minor may be completed in place of a portion of the general electives. Students must still earn 120 credits total.
- Honors & on campus students will have 15 less gen. elec. credits due to taking the C&C minor or Honors courses.

Major Related Notes

- All ACCT courses have a prerequisite of ACCT 211, which has a prerequisite of ACCT 205.
- BUSN 340, BUSN 420, and MGMT 290 have a prerequisite of BUSN 180, which has a prerequisite of MATH 102, 211, or equivalent.
- BUSN 470 has a prerequisite of ACCT 205, BUSN 240, and BUSN 320.
- ECON 320 and ECON 360 have a prerequisite of ECON 120.
- ECON 450 has a prerequisite of ECON 230 and ECON 320.
- All ENTR courses should be taken in sequential order.
- FINA 345 has a prerequisite of BUSN 320.
- FINA 350, FINA 370, and FINA 420 have a prerequisite of FINA 345.
- All HRMT courses have a prerequisite of MGMT 210.
- ➤ All MKTG courses have a prerequisite of BUSN 240.
- MKTG 320 has a prerequisite of MATH 201.
- ➤ All SPMT courses have a prerequisite of SPMT 201.
