Students with a cum. law GPA below 3.000 at the end of their first year, for traditional J.D. students, or at the end of their second year, for flexible J.D. students, must also take LAW 737 or 738 (formerly collectively PSP II), depending on which bar exam they intend to take, in their final fall semester on campus. <sup>2</sup> For Students Matriculating Fall 2023 or After

These courses are mandatory only for students with a cumulative law GPA below 3.000 at the end of their first year, for traditional J.D. students, or at the end of their second year, for flexible J.D. students. Students must take LAW 739 in their

<sup>3</sup> Honors Students are exempted from the Limited Electives requirements. The criteria for becoming and remaining an Honors Student are outlined in the law school's Policies and Procedures Manual.

<sup>4</sup> Virginia Procedure is required for any student, except Honors Students, to be certified by the Law School to take the Virginia Bar Examination. Students who are required to take a Limited Electives course and who declare they do not plan to take the Virginia Bar Examination may substitute any of the other Limited Electives courses for Virginia Procedure.
