- Licensure track Teacher Education students must earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 in their Major coursework.
- > UED 495 requires completion of all licensure requirements and all courses except UED 495 and UED 496.
- UED 496 is taken concurrently with UED 495.
- Students are strongly advised to not have an additional job while taking UED 495 and UED 496.
- ENGL 102 is a prerequisite for all ENGL courses.
- > ENGL 485 requires senior standing.
- Courses available once a year in Fall: ENGL 240, 335, 348, 361, 363, 364, UIS 350, and UED 401, 442
- Courses available once a year in Spring: ENGL 285, 305, 340, 362, 365, 485, and UED 407, 441
