- > 50% of major requirements must be taken at Regent University
- A minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA is required to maintain good academic standing.
- Some majors also require a minimum grade in all major courses.
- As a general rule, 100 and 200 level courses should be taken prior to upper level (300 and 400) level courses.

Major Related Notes

- This program is available on campus only.
- > Students in this program will learn to teach according to the Virginia Standards of Learning.
- This major leads to initial teacher licensure. Please see the Undergraduate Catalog, Teacher Education section, for specific requirements for application to the professional studies courses (UED), pre-service teaching, and licensure.
- Students should take UIS 200 Orientation to Teaching during their first year.
- Licensure track Teacher Education students must earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 in their Major coursework.
- > UED 495 requires completion of all licensure requirements and all courses except UED 495 and UED 496.
- UED 496 is taken concurrently with UED 495.
- Students are strongly advised to not have an additional job while taking UED 495 and UED 496.
- ➤ UED 487 must be taken alongside UED 480A.
- > UED 488 must be taken alongside UED 480B and has a prerequisite of UED 487.
- ➤ GOVT 240 is a prerequisite for three courses: GOVT 300, GOVT 301, GOVT 302.
- HIST 401 requires junior standing.
- Courses offered Fall only: GOVT 290, 300, 301, 305, UIS 350, UED 401, 407, 442, HIST 350
- Courses offered Spring only: UED 441, 444, GOVT 302, 303
